Re: United States – Measures on Certain Semiconductor and Other Products, and Related Services and Technologies (DS615)

Dear Ms. Chairperson:

The United States is in receipt of a letter from the Russian Federation, dated December 21, 2022, requesting to join in the consultations requested by China as circulated in document WT/DS615/1. In light of Russia's premeditated and unprovoked invasion of Ukraine, the United States does not intend to engage in business-as-usual activity with the delegation of the Russian Federation, including direct engagement on this matter. Furthermore, the United States does not consider Russia's claim of substantial interest to be well-founded.

Thus, without prejudice to WTO rules that issues of national security are not susceptible to review or capable of resolution by WTO dispute settlement,¹ the United States does not accept Russia's request to join the consultations.
